### PRINCIPAL UPDATE

Hello parents, carers and community!



Welcome back to Term 4! It is going to be a busy but amazing term. Lots of great things planned... Although, it always has a mixture of sadness and pride when planning to farewell our Grade 6 cohort as they move onto their new adventures. The details on Grade 6 Fun Day will be sent out soon. Graduation will be on the afternoon of December 5th, with more specific information to be communicated directly to families soon.

As we return to another term, I'd like to remind families that all students must have a navy blue, wide-brimmed school hat to play outside in Term 4 and Term 1. We take great pride in our uniform at Magpie PS. Our School Council review our uniform policy every three years and our uniform is compulsory. Please take the time to review our uniform on Page 3. Our school shorts and skorts are plain navy blue and are required to be at least mid-thigh length. Sports shorts and bike shorts are tighter and shorter than school shorts and are not school uniform. I thank you all for your assistance in ensuring your children are wearing the correct school uniform and are appropriately dressed for the weather. Our second hand uniform shop is also open on Tuesday afternoons. This relies on donations from the community, so if you do have any spare or old uniforms that are no longer being used, please send them to the office. We are particularly low on size 8, 10 and 12.

We are currently planning classes and staffing for 2024. We are keen to get this process finalised, so if you are aware of families wishing to join our community, or if you are planning a move, please let me know as soon as possible. Once the numbers, structures and staffing is finalised, I will announce the structures for 2024. At Magpie PS, we are committed to providing the best supports for our students, and we aim to keep our class sizes small where possible.

I know this is featured regularly, but upon the return to school this term, I have seen unsafe behaviours as students are leaving school. As adults we are responsible for ensuring our students have excellent role models for safety around cars and roads. Please ensure your child is not walking on the road, stops to check for traffic and only crosses the road at the crossing at the top gate. No students should be seen running between cars, walking down the side of the road, or crossing near the lower gates or from between parked cars. We value the safety of all of our community members. Please also remember to drive slowly - at a walking pace - when entering and leaving our school.

# SCHOOL UNIFORM




# THREE/FOUR


